
Labor Day Picnic

Pastor's Corner

"This is the day the Lord has made; Let us rejoice and be glad in it." ~ Psalm 118:24

The story, as told by Dr. Joseph Mercola, goes like this ... A blind boy sat on the steps of a building with a hat by his feet. He held up a sign which said, "I am blind. Please help." There were only a few coins in the hat.

A man was walking by. He took a few coins from his pocket and dropped them into the hat. He then took the sign, turned it around, and wrote some words. He put the sign back so that everyone who walked by would see the new words.

Soon the hat began to fill up. A lot more people were giving money to the blind boy. That afternoon the man who had changed the sign came to see how things were. The boy recognized the man's footsteps and asked, "Were you the one who changed my sign this morning? What did you write?"

The man said, "I only wrote the truth. I said what you said but in a different way. I wrote: 'Today is a beautiful day but I cannot see it.'"

If we pause to think about it, we realize that we are often like the boy who was unable to see the beautiful day. We may not be physically blind, but we can be blind just the same to the beauty of this day. How often do we miss the trees because we are watching the car in front of us in the bumper to bumper traffic? How often do we fail to appreciate the air we breathe because deadlines consume our conscious mind? How many times are we unable to enjoy human relationships because we are stressed, hurt, and insecure?

If we pause again to think about it, we realize that when God created the world He pronounced it good. Though man brought sin into the world, God continues to sustain the world and its beauty! We realize that because this is the day the Lord has made, we are fully able to rejoice and be glad in it (Psalm 118:24). Let's not let the ugliness of sin blind us to the lavish overflow of God's goodness and beauty all around us. As we do, may our hearts also overflow with thanksgiving to God for His surpassing love in providing us this beautiful day!

"Lord, please touch our eyes to see the beautiful day You have made, so that we cannot help but return thanks to You! In the blessed name of Jesus, Amen."
