

Pastor's Corner

Philip's Egg (Source Unknown)

Philip was born with Downs Syndrome. He had many health problems, but was a pleasant child, and went to Sunday School every week. As he grew, he became increasingly aware of the difference between himself and other children and feeling accepted was difficult.

When he was in the third grade his Sunday School teacher had an idea for Easter. The teacher gave empty plastic eggs to each child in the class. He instructed them to go outside, find a symbol for new life, put it into the egg, and bring it back to the classroom.

The children ran all around the church grounds, gathering their symbols, and returned to the classroom. They put all the eggs on a table, and the teacher began to open them one by one. When the first egg revealed a flower, the children ooh-ed and aahed. Another egg contained a little butterfly. Some third-graders laughed as one egg contained a rock.

When the teacher opened the next egg, there was nothing inside. The children, as eight-year-olds do, mocked, "That's dumb! Somebody didn't do it right." The teacher felt a tug on his shirt and looked down. "It's mine, Philip said. It's mine." Some children scolded, "You don't ever do things right, Philip. There's nothing there!"

"I did so do it right!" Philip said. "I did do it right. The tomb is empty!"

There was stunned silence. From then on, the children took Philip in as part of their group. Philip was set free from the tomb of his different-ness.

Philip died that summer. At his memorial service, his Sunday School classmates and teacher marched up to the altar, not with flowers to cover over the stark reality of death, but with an empty plastic egg.

The Bible says that "Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20). Jesus' resurrection is but a foretaste of eternal resurrection for all those who follow Him. Moreover, Jesus sets us free now from our dark tombs of rejection, addictions, and sinful habits.
