Dr. Pat Zukeran, Christian apologist and founder and Executive Director of Evidence and Answers research and teaching ministry, has taught throughout October on Thursday evenings at our church.



The 40 to 50 people who attended each week were blessed to learn about Israel's past, present and future — as well as Israel's relationship to the Church. We also learned about the arguments for each of the pre, mid and post Tribulation views on the Rapture.

Dr. Zukeran is particularly skilled at presenting all sides of an issue clearly, while substantiating his own opinion with solid evidence. For example, bible scholars have four different views on interpreting the book of

Revelation that include the Idealist View, the Historicist View, the Preterist View and the Futurist View, which were thoroughly explained in session one of the course. "Despite the various views, all agree that God is sovereign and in charge of all that occurs in history and its ultimate conclusion," concludes Dr. Zukeran as he helps us navigate through the different opinions to what matters most.

Pastor's Corner

Pausing for Thanksgiving and Praise

"Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."
1 Thessalonians 5:18

In October of 1863, in the midst of a painful Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln penned these words:

*"The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature, that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever watchful providence of Almighty God ... I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the **last Thursday of November next, as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise** to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens."*

There are two quotes above. I admit that I find it difficult to follow Paul's admonition to the Thessalonians to "give thanks in all circumstances." It isn't that I find it hard to give thanks, but I am "prone to forget" God's goodness, and so I often forget to thank God.

It appears that I am not alone. Prior to the President Lincoln's proclamation in 1863, the states held their own Thanksgiving recognitions on various dates. Rather than leaving Thanksgiving to chance or individual discretion, Sarah Josepha Hale urged Lincoln to issue a national proclamation to peg down a day of Thanksgiving so it would be part of our nation's consciousness.

Why do I like Thanksgiving? Because I tend to forget. For me, Thanksgiving continues to peg down a reminder in my calendar to pause, reflect on "our beneficent Father," and thank Him for His gracious favor whatever the circumstances may be.

Perhaps you are well-intended, but, like me, tend to forget. I'd like to invite you to join us for our Thanksgiving Service on November 18, the Sunday before Thanksgiving Day. Join with us as we take time to pause, soften our hearts, recognize God's bountiful goodness, and return thanks to Him.
