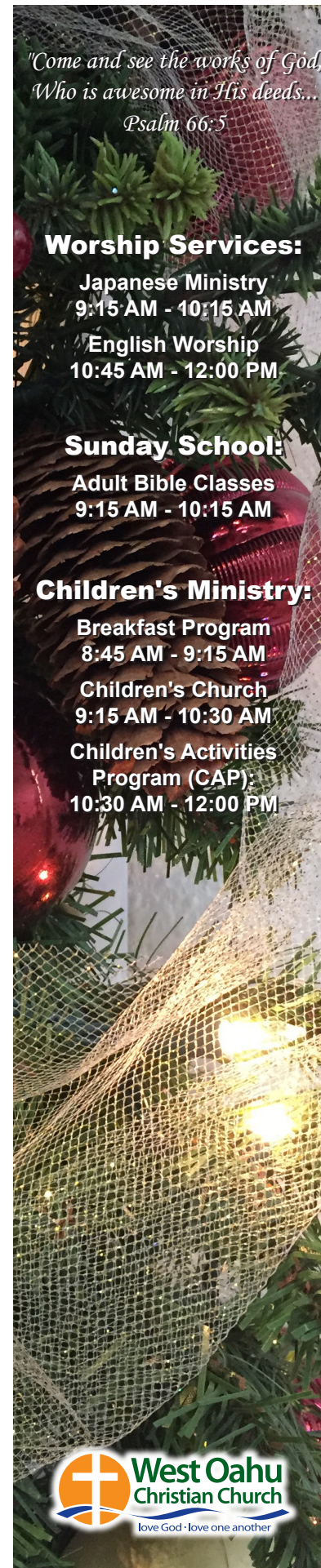

## Pastor's Corner - YOU!

*For unto YOU is born this day in the city of David a Savior...* (Luke 2:11, ESV)

Christmas is often said to be the season of giving. And it is! It is when we celebrate God giving His Son, Jesus Christ, to humanity. Because of God’s gracious gift, there is a sense in which we reflect God's generosity when we give. But in this article I would like to switch things around for a moment, and say ... **It's all about YOU.** (Huh?)

At Christmas, God came for YOU. On that first Christmas the angel declared to the shepherds, “... unto YOU is born ...” Note that the significance of Christmas is not just that the Savior was born, but born to YOU. The sentence structure emphasizes the recipients of the angel’s message such that would lead the shepherds to ask, “Unto me???” In other words, as far as God is concerned, YOU are the reason Jesus came!

It's seems a bit ironic, doesn't it? It's like a twist in the plot took place, except that the focus on YOU has always been there, in plain view!

Don’t get me wrong. On Christmas we rightfully celebrate Jesus birth because it is truly one of the most extraordinary events of all time! But I wonder if our marveling might be one-sided, and so may unintentionally obscure God's reason for Christmas? Isn’t the “YOU” in Christmas important? So I say it again... God's reason for Christmas is YOU!

The angel makes clear that Jesus came to save YOU. Saviors save. Who? YOU! The question gnawing in our hearts is, “saved from what?” Well, what are the deepest things YOU (that’s right, YOU!) need to be saved from? Although God cares for the hair on our head and unnoticed blades of grass, for now can we move beyond the petty, dime-a-dozen issues of life like our backaches, need for a pay raise, or what Christmas gifts we should get for our friends? Sin has countless little “deaths” we face all the time. But sin also creates some truly profound “deaths” doesn’t it? Fear of failure. Indescribable griefs. Lack of meaning in life. Haunting guilt. Anxiety about eternal destiny.

At Christmas, God would love nothing more than to take care of all that for you through the gift of His Son, Jesus Christ. When YOU receive Jesus Christ, YOU receive all that comes with Him – eternal life, purpose, and joy! Now, just so you don’t get big headed, not everything is about YOU. But much of Christmas is! Let God transform your life by humbly receiving God’s gift to YOU!
