
gentlemen who "fought the good fight, finished the race and kept the FAITH" (2 Timothy 4:7-8). A major accomplishment and a job well done.



Pastor's Corner

Aloha,

It's been nearly a three-year journey going through the **Gospel of Luke**. That's just as long as Jesus' ministry, so we should be wonderful disciples by now! We have read, considered, and endeavored to obey the teachings of Jesus Christ, and, most importantly, get to know Him better. We "heard" Jesus teach some things about the Kingdom of God that reveal just how unkingdomlike we are, and hence our need for Him! Preaching sermons covering the end of Jesus' ministry gave me my first platform to preach a sermon on the end-times and the mark of the Beast. I think we would agree that there are things occurring in the world today that enable endtimes prophecies like no other previous age. By God's grace may our eyes be opened to possible traps that Satan has in store for humanity, and may we choose to firmly follow Jesus!

Our upcoming sermon series is on **The Church**. The Church is God's amazing manifest presence on earth, and God's Word gives believers a target at which to aim. The series will include material that I go over in WOCC's Membership class: What is the OMS Conference? Who is WOCC? What is a Believer in Jesus? And what is my philosophy of leadership. While everyone who became a member since I arrived at WOCC has been through this material, it should be very beneficial to everyone, even long-time members.

In recent years our **Small Groups ministry** has offered general teaching sessions on specific topics on Thursday evenings during the Fall. This year WOCC is sponsoring Gary Lau in teaching 100 Great Events of the Bible. As a preview and teaser, Pastor Gary will be speaking at WOCC's Sunday Worship Service at 10:45 on September 8. Bring a friend!

Beneath all the various topics and activities that we do at WOCC, what drives me is an unrelenting gravity to make disciples. I constantly think and imagine what it means to make disciples, and how WOCC can pursue Jesus's primary command. Because many others have this passion, on **October 12** the Hawaii Region OMS Churches will be hosting a **Discipleship Conference** for our Conference churches, with other churches being invited. The speaker, **Dr**. Jerry White, along with his wife Mary, have international experiences that enabled them to see that discipleship is not about methods. What works in one country will fail in another country. Jerry guotes from A.W. Tozer's book, *The Root of the Righteous*:

"As the needle of the compass has an affinity for the north magnetic pole, so the heart can keep true to its secret love though separated by miles and years. What the loved object is can be discovered by seeing what direction our thoughts turn when they are released from the hard restraints of study or work when we are free to think whatever we will ... When we are free from our assignments, what really grips our hearts? ... This reveals what we really are."

As I listened to Jerry, two words came to mind, love and authenticity. You can find more information about the Discipleship Conference on the inside of this newsletter. Hope to see you there!
