# Aloha Reception 2019 - Lorraine Respicio




Gloria Onishi said, "This course was excellent. Just exactly what I needed to get a comprehensive overview of the Bible yet simple to understand."

### Elder's Corner

"400 years of silence"

"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel." Isaiah 7:14

Merry Christmas! During these past few months, WOCC and other churches had the pleasure of attending Pastor Gary Lau's class "100 Great Events of the Bible" held on Thursday evenings. In one of our classes, Gary taught that there was a 400-year period of "silence" between the Old Testament and the New Testament. During this time God did not speak through patriarchs, judges, kings or prophets. Prior to this period, God regularly spoke to and through them. In the preceding scripture, Isaiah made the prophecy of Jesus' virgin birth about 700 years before it occurred. And the prophet Zechariah wrote of a future king riding into Jerusalem on a humble donkey about 500 years before Jesus rode into Jerusalem.

What is also interesting is that although God may not have been speaking to these people, he was definitely still at work. During this 400-year period, Alexander the Great from Greece came to power and Greek became the new language that united the lands of the ancient world. This eventually led to the translation of the Hebrew Torah into Greek. After the demise of Greece, the Roman Empire came to power. And as the empire expanded, roads were built to move its people throughout. These same roads would be used to eventually spread the Gospel!

Today, God speaks to us in many ways. Through the Holy Spirit, prayer, and miracles, just to name a few. God is never silent. He is always working and communicating with us. However, oftentimes in relationships with others, miscommunication and the lack of communication can be huge barriers. It can lead to misunderstandings, damaged relationships, and malaise. As fallible humans, we do not know what's on each other's minds and hearts as God knows of each of us. Thus we cannot afford to be silent. We need to encourage each other to be open and honest in communication. We should strive to engage in healthy confrontation and active listening. And as we faithfully communicate with God, we should also try to do so with each other. Thereby strengthening our relationships and the church.

During this season of joy, God stopped being "silent" and lead with action. He sent His son Jesus Christ who openly communicated and demonstrated His love for everyone. It is my prayer that we follow God's example of healing and strengthening relationships by opening up communication. I encourage you to have that talk with that someone you have been meaning to talk with. Or if that's a stretch, maybe a nice card or a text message just to get started. I don't think we can wait 400 years!
