### Nori, I Think It's Time.... by Linda Kunimitsu

In March of my third year as a Christian, I was frustrated. For over two years I had been trying to get Nori to become a Christian. I wanted so much to be equally yoked. I wanted him to feel the joy I was feeling. I wanted him to be with me in church. I wanted him to sing all the new songs I was learning. I wanted the assurance that he would go to heaven. I wanted him to experience the heart-warming love of Christ Jesus.

Nothing worked. In fact, he seemed to be drawing away from me. I finally said, "Lord, I don't care. You handle it. I'm tired already. He's yours."

I'm a rather stubborn person, but once I make up my mind to let go, I'm able to do so. Not in anger, but to truly let God do his work.

In November of that same year, 8 months later in 1989, a friend from church dropped me and our house guest, Nedrah Abadir, off from a bible study. Nedrah, an Egyptian missionary with YWAM (Youth With A Mission), had been coming to our church, and we had formed a friendship. I asked my friends to come on in as it was still early. Our home is split-level. We entered. It was dark. Nori must be upstairs. The three of us sat down to discuss the Bible study. I was surprised when Nori came down and sat in his recliner. My friends and I continued our discussion. Surprisingly, Nori asked a question, which, some 34 years later, I don't remember what it was.

Now, coincidentally, Nedrah had had polio as a child and walked with a noticeable limp, even with special elevated shoes made especially for her. Nori has also had a limp since childhood because of a hip condition. Nedrah had the most engaging smile that instantly warmed your heart.

Before I knew it, she had slid over to Nori on the carpeted floor and sat at his feet. "Nori," she said, looking at him with her sweet, engaging smile. "I think it's time you accept Jesus as your Lord and Savior."

Before I realized what was happening, Nori replied nonchalantly, "Okay," and Nedrah led Nori through the sinner's prayer to accept Jesus as his Lord and Savior.

Two days later, it was the most beautiful Sunday ever, to have Nori at my side in church. As we both teared at the beautiful worship songs, my heart filled with thankfulness. "And the gospel must first be preached to all nations."
