Twice Adopted

I remember my father telling me when I was very young, to "Never be ashamed that you are adopted". I didn't even know what "adopted" meant at first. Over time, my parents told me how I came to be their only child.

My father met my mother while serving in the Army in Japan. They moved to Hawaii after he was discharged. My mother could not have children, so my father investigated the possibility of adoption. One day my father received a call from an attorney friend who informed him that there was a child available at an orphanage that day. My father made arrangements to pick me up and called my mother to shop for some milk and diapers as he would be coming home with a child.

After reaching home, my mother discovered that I did not have the strength to cry. She took me to the doctor who diagnosed me with asthma. The doctor warned that I was not in good health and advised her to return me to the orphanage. Determined to nurse me to health, my mother insisted on keeping me and eventually I was healed of my asthma. Our family did not have a lot of money, but I have fond memories of growing up in Pearl City.

As I was about to graduate from Pearl City High, I was having struggles at home. We moved in with my grandparents who were living in a 2bedroom home in Waipahu. The house was too small for 5 people and conflicts arose.....some of which had their roots decades ago earlier. I was not very happy and was looking for answers on how to deal with my problems. These conflicts made life at home very uncomfortable, and I began looking for answers on how to deal with my problems.

I then remembered a friend from Judo who was going through a rather negative transformation. He became angry and impatient; unlike the person I once knew. Then one day, he came to Judo, totally changed. His language, countenance and attitude reflected a light I had not seen before. He shared with me (and anyone else who would listen) about encountering Jesus and accepting Him as His Lord and Savior. I wanted what he had.

Before my freshman year at UH, I was standing in line to register for my classes and saw 2 guys coming toward me and talking to everyone in line. When they got to me, Ron Kam from the Navigator Ministry said, "We are from a campus ministry. Would you like to know about the claims of Christ?"

I was very interested. So, Ron made an appointment to meet with me

on campus once a week to do a Bible Study. He showed me the "Bridge Illustration" and explained how sin separated all of us from God, but God sent His Son Jesus to live among us, to die for our sins and be raised from the dead so I could have a relationship with Him. I realized that, even though I was healed of my asthma as a child, there was a condition from which I still suffered. I didn't even know I had it. It was called sin. And God wanted to deal with it so I could forever have a relationship with the Lord of the universe. One day in September of 1978, I bowed my head, confessed my sin and acknowledged what Jesus did for me His dying for my sins and giving me a new relationship with God. I then asked Him to become Lord of my life.

As promised in John 1:12, as I "believed and accepted Him", I became a child of God. Once again, I had been adopted; this time into the family of God. My soul was cleansed and my sins forgiven as I confessed my sin and received forgiveness as promised in 1 John 1:9.

The struggles at home that led me to seek Jesus did not immediately disappear. Over time, I learned to trust His promise that "all things work together for good to those who love God" and are "called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28). My mother eventually became a firm believer and attended our church, and I believe my father accepted Christ before passing away as well. I look forward to a joyous reunion in Heaven one day!

Ron Kam taught me how to be a disciple of Christ and my heart began to change as I read the Word of God, prayed, sought fellowship with fellow believers and shared my faith. Like Ron, I wanted to take what I learned and pass it on to others. God has given me the privilege to teach Sunday School, lead small groups and preach at West Oahu Christian Church.

God also blessed me with the ability to play guitar and piano as a worship team leader. It is such a blessing to see others praising and worship our Lord with the same songs that have touched my heart over the years.

I praise God for the blessings (and the challenges) of living for Jesus. As I have "delighted myself in the Lord", He has given me many of the "desires of my heart" (Psalm 37:4). I thank God for a loving wife who loves Jesus, a good job, and the ability to compete in a sport I enjoy (bowling). I am especially thankful for my brothers and sisters in Christ (especially those at West Oahu Christian Church) who have been a part of my life journey as God has allowed me to share Christ and His Word in ministry. Thank you, Lord, for allowing me to be adopted a second time; this time into the family of God.
